Beate Ringwald, is our international PhD fellowship student. As part of her 4 year program, she will conduct a secondary data analysis on Associations between IPV-related attitudes, knowledge, skills and behaviours, and occurrence of IPV among women and men in Kawangware, Nairobi, Kenya.

This she believes will contribute in informing future interventions that link HIV and GBV services not only in Kenya but the East Africa region that she calls home.

“I am married in Uganda and have worked with local women on Sexual and Reproductive Health in the country for 3 years. I am passionate about women and young people’s health and I believe this opportunity will expand my knowledge of the health issues in East Africa.” Beate

Beate’s PhD is sponsored by the Medical Research Council of United Kingdom through the Lancaster University and Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine where Beate is undertaking her PhD. The mother of one, hopes to also bring her family along during the research visits.
